JUNE BEARING STRAWBERRY

This traditionally grown strawberry plant produces one large crop a year during a two to three week period. As its name suggests, these large, juicy fruits are usually ready for harvest in June. This perennial plant should be planted 18" apart in rows of 24". You should space each row about 4' apart. The June Bearing Strawberry should be planted in spring just as soon as the soil is dry enough to be worked. As with any Strawberry plant, ripe berries should be picked immediately in order to prevent spoiling. For optimal plant vigor and production, pinch off all flowers during the first year in your garden. June Bearing Strawberries are perfect for making jams and freezing. You can't go wrong with these big, juicy strawberries!
